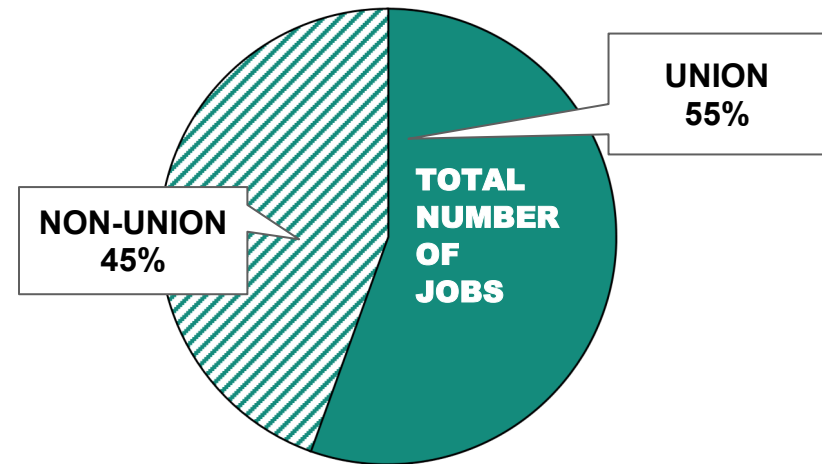

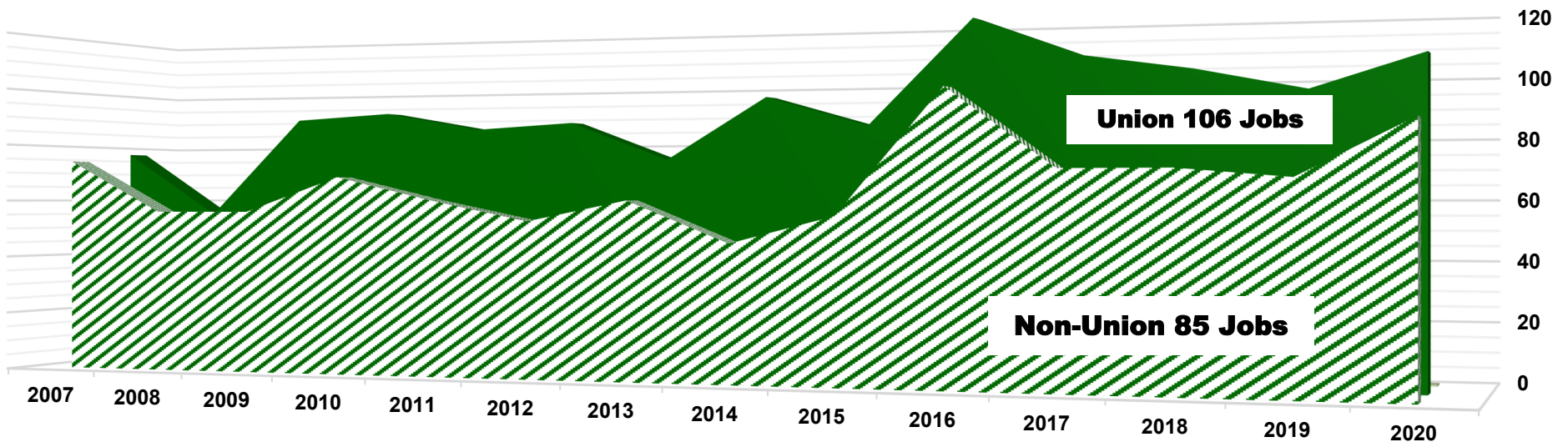

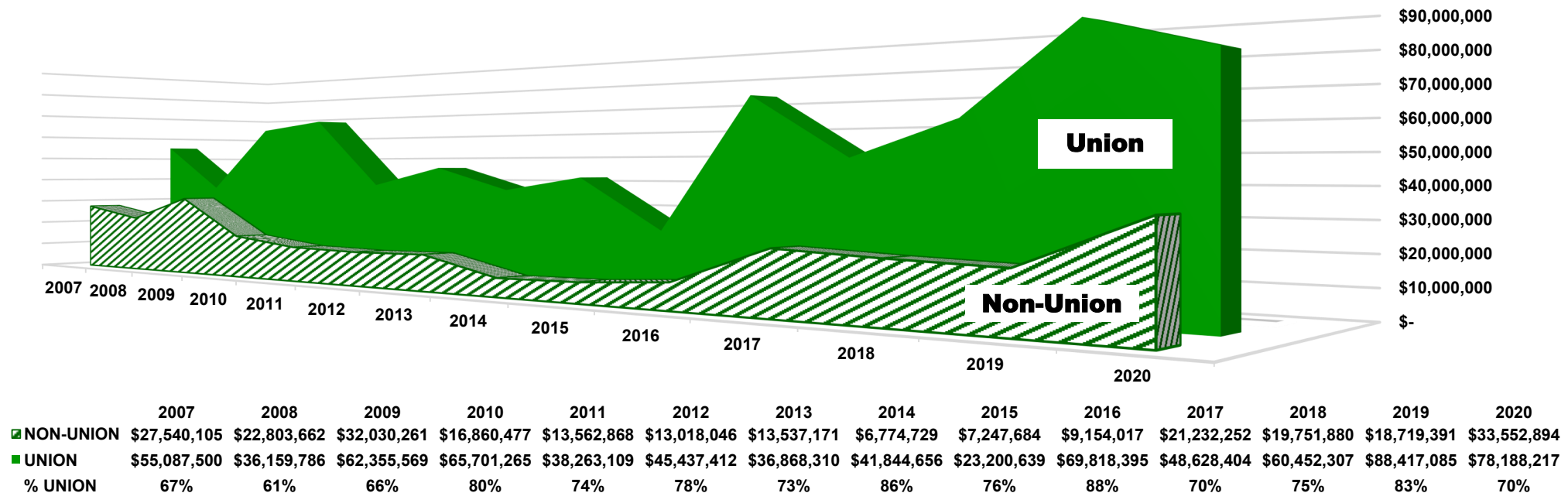

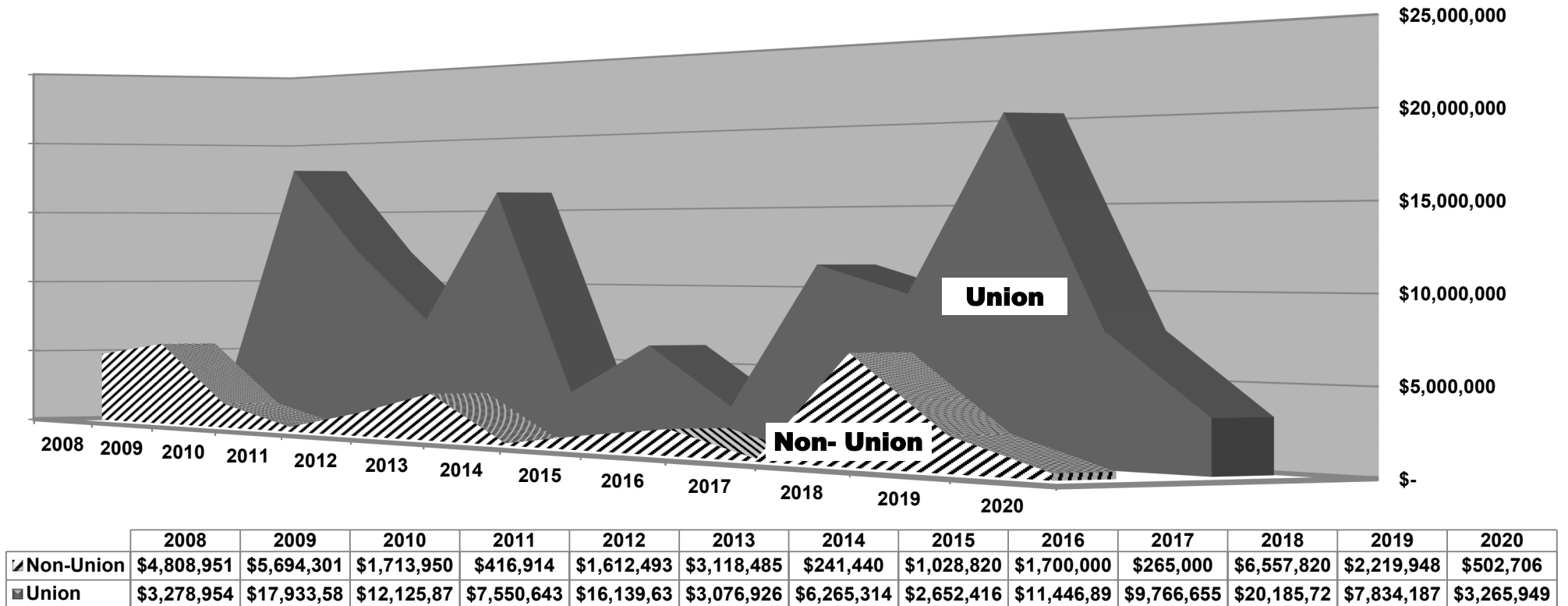

Notice of Right to Obtain Review - Formal Hearing

Liquidated Damages
