**SUBJECT: 2010 California Building Standards Code Effective Date, and Guide to  
CALGreen**

This Information Bulletin is intended as a reminder to local code enforcement agencies and interested parties of the code changes which become effective January 1, 2011, and to provide notice of an update to the Guide to the California Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen).

**2010 California Building Standards Code (CBS Code)**

The 2010 CBS Code, in California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 24, is effective January 1, 2011. For the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), CCR Title 24 is applicable to design and construction of residential occupancies<sup>1</sup>, factory-built housing<sup>2</sup>, permanent buildings and by reference accessory structures which are constructed in mobilehome and special occupancy parks. The CBS Code will apply to all buildings and structures with a permit application date on or after January 1, 2011. Factory-built housing which does not have a permit application date before January 1, 2011 shall comply with the 2010 CBS Code if it enters production on or after January 1, 2011. The permit application date is established by local government. Interested parties should contact the applicable building department or enforcing agency to determine how the permit application date is established in a specific jurisdiction.

Building officials or interested parties should refer to Building Standards Bulletin 99-01 dated March 17, 1999, issued by and available through the California Building Standards Commission (CBSC), for requirements in state law regarding the adoption and modification of the California Building Standards Code by local government. Portions of the 1997 Uniform Housing Code (UHC) continue to be adopted reference in the State Housing Law Regulations, Title 25, CCR, Division 1, Chapter 1, subchapter 1, section 32. Only Chapters 4, 5, 6 and sections 701.2 and 701.3 of the 1997 UHC are adopted and applicable for the enforcement of use, maintenance and occupancy requirements by local code enforcement agencies. Because the 1997 UHC is currently out of print HCD has posted these sections on the HCD website [www.hcd.ca.gov](http://www.hcd.ca.gov).

<sup>2</sup> Factory-built housing does not include manufactured homes, mobilehomes, multifamily manufactured housing or commercial modulars (see HSC section 19971).

**CALGreen**

In June 2010, HCD released "A Guide to the California Green Building Standards Code (Low-rise Residential)," which provided commentary, background, questions and answers, and helpful forms enabling a code user to better understand and comply with mandatory measures contained in CALGreen. An update to the first publication which contains additional information about the mandatory portion of the code provides guidance about the appendices and voluntary tiers and provides more compliance tools will be sent electronically to interested parties and be posted to the HCD website <http://www.hcd.ca.gov/CALGreen.html> over the next few weeks.

**Adopted Codes and Availability**

Building Departments are reminded that each state department and each city, county, or city and county shall have an up-to-date copy of Title 24 available for public inspection (*HSC §18942(d)*). Additionally, each city, county, and city and county shall obtain and maintain at least one copy of building standards and other state regulations relating to buildings published in Titles 8, 19, 20, 24, and 25 of the CCR, and that these codes be maintained in the office of the building official responsible for the administration and enforcement of state building standards (*HSC §18942(e)(1)*). Copies of these codes may be purchased as noted below.
