

Last week we were officially notified that IBEW International Vice-President John O'Rourke had developed a new <u>IBEW Ninth District Portability Policy</u>. The IBEW Ninth District covers California, Nevada, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Hawaii and the northern part of Idaho.

In addition to the conditions specified in the National Agreement on Employee Portability, the new policy <u>may</u> allow the employer up to two bargaining unit employees per construction job, and one of those two <u>may</u> be an apprentice (provided both involved JATC's agree).

Since the new Policy incorporates many of the terms of the <u>Agreement on Employee Portability</u> including the <u>Questions and Answers</u>, we have linked them for your review. We have also provided <u>Questions and Answers specific to this new policy</u>. You should understand that the Agreement on Employee Portability is an agreement between the National Office of NECA and the International Office of the IBEW that remains in effect from year to year. The new 9th District Inside Manpower Portability Policy is a unilateral addendum to the National Agreement that can be terminated on 30 days' notice. That is why it will be especially important to be a little patient as this unfolds, as there will need to be buy-in from many Local Unions, JATC's and contractors to make this work the way it should. One immediate problem could be unemployment of 10% of the workforce or more than a three week wait for apprentices returning to work after a layoff. <u>We recommend that you check with the Local</u> <u>Union where you plan to use the policy prior to implementation to make sure it is available.</u>

ELECTRI International's newest study

Measuring Productivity and the Impact of Prefabrication on Productivity

is now available for the electrical construction industry.

The study examined how field and office productivity and the use of prefabrication in the Electrical Contracting industry are intertwined. The research explored the impact and use of prefabrication within Lean Construction and BIM and VDC. The focus was to untangle and objectively characterize the relationship between productivity and prefabrication. The investigation resulted in a set of best practices that can help Electrical Contractors optimize prefabrication to obtain peak productivity.

The research team, led by Mark O. Federle, Marquette University, conducted specific "case studies" with 14 leading union and non-union electrical contractors and with leading mechanical contractors throughout the United States. Individual site visits and personal interviews allowed a deeper dive into the changes electrical contractors made to increase their use of prefabrication. The case studies explored the impact on productivity for field and office operations. These studies provided tactics to guide other electrical contractors who want to increase their prefabrication efforts and understand how they could use prefabrication to increase their competitiveness in the marketplace.

The final investigative report includes the findings from the case studies and provides a series of tactics that may be used by an electrical contractor for implementing prefabrication and measuring its impact on productivity.

The report presents three different levels of tactics for contractors at different stages:


- beginners at prefabrication,
- contractors seeking to dramatically increase their prefabrication efforts
- advanced prefabricators who can benefit from a few additional tactics.
