The Annual Meeting of the Contra Costa County Electrical Industry Trust will be held at Zio Fraedo's Restaurant, in Pleasant Hill, Tuesday, September 25, 2012 @ 6:00 p.m. Our September NECA Chapter Membership Meeting will be held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting, and is open to all signatory contractors.

Each year the Board of Trustees report on the progress of the Electrical Industry Trust and the other Trust funds that are included in the hourly contribution rate, which increased from \$.85/hour to \$1.35 in July. The additional funding will be applied to our Apprenticeship and Journeymen Training Programs and our LMCC.

The Electrical Industry Trust will also be holding an election during this meeting to fill two Trustee positions. Candidates must be a representative of a Contra Costa-based firm that makes contributions on a regular basis to the various Trust funds under the Inside Wiremans Agreement. If interested, please contact the NECA office to get the proper nomination form and procedures.

We are also pleased to announce that Mr. Charles Ramsey, a Board of Member and the driving force behind the West Contra Costa Unified School District will be our featured speaker at the meeting. We know of no other individual in any political position, from the President of the United States on down, that has done more for our NECA/IBEW contractors than Mr. Ramsey. Shortly after the Richmond School district declared bankruptcy in 1991, Charles was elected to the WCCUSD Board and began embarking on a mission to revamp every school in the District. He is now close to achieving that goal, as the West Contra Costa School District has had the second largest building program in the State over the past 15 years. Only LA Unified has built more. Charles has also been the catalyst for helping our contractors get paid by being the first district in Northern California to post payments to general contractors on the District Web Site. In fact, he has even helped spread our message to other Districts in the area. In 2006, the National Office of NECA honored Charles with NECA's Industry Partner Award.

PG&E recently hired a consulting firm called Workforce Incubator to try to find our why companies may be putting of energy efficiency upgrades.

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) estimates as many as 29,000 clean energy jobs will be needed in PG&E's territory by 2020.

Engineers, energy auditors, project managers, skilled contractors and demand-side energy efficiency experts—to name just a few—will all be called on to make commercial, industrial and agricultural buildings more energy efficient.

Workforce Incubator is conducting a confidential survey for PG&E to determine how to help companies like yours overcome your clients' barriers to adopting energy efficiency solutions. The survey is via phone call and should take approximately 20 minutes.


